



Surgical Assisting and Sterile Set Up for Implants and Grafting Procedures

This course will prepare surgical assistants to become more effective, knowledgeable, and confident members of the surgical team. Implant and grafting success, is dependent on the skills and knowledge of the all team members.

During this program you will learn the importance of a sterile surgical field, become comfortable with instruments, motors, and surgical procedures. There will be a hands-on portion, where you will be required to scrub, put on sterile gloves and gowns, set up a surgical, operatory and learn the surgical preparation of a patient.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Review of surgical procedures including: implant placement, bone grafting, sinus elevations etc.
- Room preparation
- Room draping
- Patient preparation and draping
- Surgical scrub up
- Learn to put on sterile gloves and keep them sterile
- Gowning of the surgeon and assistants
- Sterile delivery of implants, grafting materials etc.
- Tips and tricks to be an efficient surgical assistant
- Armamentaria
 - Instruments: set up and care
 - Hand pieces and what they are used for
 - Motor set up and trouble shooting
 - Getting organized and increasing set speed

This protocol is used on a regular basis in office. She has taught this technique in Vancouver, Victoria, Calgary, and Edmonton. Penny encourages dental assistants everywhere to use these techniques in office to ensure healthy surgical procedures for patients.



TEENA DHENSAW, CDA began her career in Dentistry in 1997. She worked for a GP for ten years, then moved to assisting a periodontist in 2012, where she learned Sterile Surgical Set Up and how to assist surgery. She has assisted many procedures, including Extractions, Implant placement, Implant Explant, Guided Bone Regeneration, Sinus Lifts and Augmentation, Ridge Splits, Soft Tissue Grafting,

Biopsies, taking CT Scans, and processing PRF/PRP. Ms. Dhensaw also has assisted Dr. Anderson with his study clubs and taught CDAs how to set-up and care for their instruments and equipment.
