**Single Implant Restoration:
A Step by Step Approach**

Dental implants have been implemented in restorative dentistry with a very high success rate in the past few decades. During this period, we have gained significant knowledge about different aspects of implant dentistry: diagnosis and case selection, prosthetic treatment planning, bone and soft tissue biology, implant design and biomechanics, surgical protocols, treatment sequencing and maintenance. In the past few years we have been struggling with the management of some complications and this has made us more aware of the importance of systematic planning for a better long term prognosis of this treatment option.

This lecture will provide an up-to-date, step by step review of clinically relevant science and techniques in single implant restoration. You will learn how to analyze the edentulous site, plan for the restoration, transfer your prosthodontics planning to your surgical site and gradually build up the foundation for optimum restoration of a single missing tooth. We will review the latest protocols in maintenance of single implants.

Advances & Controversies in Endo You Should Know

This practical course, full of honest tips, tricks and advise, is for general dentists who want to keep up-to-date with hot topics, controversies and advances in endodontics. And, if you haven't changed your root canal protocols in the past two years, then this is a course for you.

The pros and cons behind nearly all aspects of endodontics will be discussed. Review misconceptions and current guidelines for use of intra-canal medications, analgesics and antibiotics in endodontics, and the salvageability and restoration of endo-treated teeth.

- Learn which **ENDO TECHNIQUES AND ARMAMENTARIA** do not have clinical benefits and which do benefit your endodontic treatments by simplifying and improving your root canals.

The course is meant to be very interactive and incorporates 3D imaging and HD videos.

- Point and counter-point review of many cases and whether teeth should / could be saved with endodontic treatment, or replaced with an implant.
- Review of the most current endodontic, surgical and prosthodontic protocols, materials and techniques.
