

 - 5. Research






DENTAL HYGIENE EDUCATION AT UBC

Course Planning


- Full-time or part-time study
- Part-time study allows up to 5 years to complete degree.
- Must enroll in a minimum of 3 credits per academic year to maintain registration
- Carefully consider the amount of time you will have to devote to coursework.
- Three credit course = 8-10 hours of study per week.
- Remember you are taking 3-4th year university-level courses.


Dental Hygiene Graduate Outcomes

UBC Dental Hygiene Graduate Outcomes Survey

In December 2020, over a two-week period, UBC Dental Hygiene graduates were surveyed. Dental Hygiene graduates from the Faculty of Dentistry include those who earned either a Dental Hygiene Diploma or a Bachelor of Dental Science (Dental Hygiene) degree. This survey sought to understand the professional practice setting(s) of Dental Hygiene graduates and any graduate education pursued. Over 250 graduates responded to this survey (response rate 40%).
